We know that sometimes the admissions process can be confusing so this year there is a new service available to help you – Choice Advice.

Why would I need Choice Advice?

The aim is to offer you impartial, independent advice about secondary schools and help you fill in the admissions form. The service is aimed at all parents but we know some parents find it more difficult than others to choose a secondary school, maybe:

- You have just moved or are moving to Nottingham
- English is not your first language
- Your child has additional needs
- Just need a helping hand

Tips to choosing a secondary school place

If your child is in year 6 they will receive 'Going to School in Nottingham' guide along with the orange application form in September.

Attend any open evenings or open days held by the secondary schools. This will give your child a feel of what the school is like.

Obtain a prospectus that will tell you more about the school.

Speak to other parents who may have a child already attending.

What sort of advice can I get?

Our Choice Advisors will aim to make sure you have a full understanding of all the information available and that it is presented clearly to you. This could include:

- how the admissions system works
- admissions policies for different types of schools
- school performance and value added data
- school Ofsted reports
- oversubscription criteria
- school profiles, ethos, special facilities etc
- special needs policy and provision
- school specialism
- time of the school day and term dates
- travel details
- uniform policies and lists
- how the appeal process works

It's important to remember that our advice is impartial - we cannot, and do not, recommend or guarantee a place at any school. We also cannot make a decision on your behalf – the choice of school for your child is yours.

Who runs the Choice Advice service?

Choice Advisors are part of the Families Information Service. The service works across the city offering information, advice and assistance to parents and carers about a wide range of family support issues. The Families Information Service is operated by Nottingham City Council's Children's Services.
