As part of the safe and efficient operation of the road network, Nottingham City Council is deploying 15 traffic count and Automatic Number Plate Recognition (ANPR) sensors to monitor the number of vehicles using roads, as well as their average journey times, in the Lenton area of Nottingham around the University of Nottingham campus. The roads where sensors are to be located are as follows: Abbey Bridge, Beeston Road, Derby Road, University Boulevard, Wollaton Vale and Woodside Road.

We will use the information provided by the sensors to help inform future improvements to the infrastructure of the Nottingham highway network. The basis under which the Council uses personal data for this purpose is that this is necessary for the performance of a task carried out in the public interest by the Council or in the exercise of official authority vested in the Council.

In the first 31 days of the sensors becoming operational, Vivacity Ltd, who process this data on behalf of Nottingham City Council, will undertake video recording on an intermittent basis for the sole purpose of system testing and development. After this time the sensor will be fully operational and produce anonymous data only.

The new data protection law known as the General Data Protection Regulation provides for the following rights as prescribed by the legislation:

- A right to request a copy of your information
- A right to request rectification of inaccurate personal data

- A right to request erasure of your data known as ‘the right to be forgotten’
- A right to in certain circumstances to request restriction of processing
- A right in certain circumstances to request portability of your data to another provider
- A right to object to processing of data in certain circumstances
- A right regarding automated decision making including profiling
