Funding Opportunities for Schools

There are currently a number of funding opportunities available for schools to apply for. This includes a **Childcare Expansion Grant Funding Programme** to create additional provision for children under the age of 3 years of age and/or before and after school wraparound provision for Reception to Year 6, from 8am - 6pm during term time only, the **School Based Nurseries Capital Grant** offering up to £150,000 in capital funding to upgrade spare space to create or expand on-site nurseries and the **Breakfast Club Early Adopter Scheme** which will be introducing free breakfast clubs in up to 750 early adopter schools from April 2025 as part of a test and learn phase in advance of national roll out. Free Online Courses for Parents, Carers, Grandparents & Teens - Please share with families you work with Nottingham City Council have partnered with the Solihull Approach to offer free online courses for families living across the region. These courses have been designed to support parents, carers and grandparents understand more about their child's feelings and behaviour and raise them to be emotionally aware, sociable and confident. Courses are tailored for all stages of a child's development to help all family members through reflective, supportive learning without judgment. For teens, specialist online learning will help then make sense of brain changes during adolescence and what that means for how they feel, make decisions, and connect in important relationships.
