

Peep Learning Together Programme Training

What is Peep?

Peep Learning Together Programme is an evidence-based intervention, developed by the charity Peep. It provides comprehensive child development activities and information that trained practitioners can share with families - in groups, drop-ins or 1:1 work. Peep sessions involve songs, stories, activities and discussion linked to the Programme's five strands of learning:

personal, social and emotional development

communication and language

early literacy development

early numeracy development

health and physical development



The Peep LTP uses the ORIM framework which supports parents in:

- Sharing ideas for opportunities through everyday events and experiences
- Recognising achievements and valuing their child's efforts
- Interacting with their child, doing something together
- The importance of being a model for their child

Training aims

the training equips practitioners to:

- engage and support parents to build on what they already do to enhance their baby's or child's early learning and development (contributing to school-readiness), through talking and playing as part of everyday life,
- explore practical ideas, strategies, and resources, using the comprehensive and flexible Peep Learning Together Programme (followed up by extensive post-course delivery support),
- deliver universal or targeted sessions with parents and children together, to meet local needs - in one-to-one, group or drop-in sessions; indoors, outdoors, or virtually,
- gain practitioner accreditation unit (optional, see below: 3 credits at level 3 in England, Wales and Northern Ireland, equivalent level 6 in Scotland).
