Early Maths Programme available for Nurseries!

Through the DfE's Accelerator Fund, early years settings are being invited to sign up to deliver Maths Champions. Developed by the NDNA, <u>Maths Champions</u> delivers high-quality professional development to early years educators to support improvements to early maths provision in PVI, maintained and school-based settings. The programme trains a Maths Champion and Deputy Champion in key mathematical concepts. Practitioners receive online training and one to one support with reviewing current maths provision, and planning and implementing steps to improve maths practice over the one-year programme duration. Recent independent evaluation found children taught by practitioners who received the programme made, on average, 3 months' additional progress in maths and language development. There are places for early years settings to start the 12-month programme in April, May and June 2025. DfE's Apprenticeship Announcement

The government have announced changes to apprenticeship requirements that will grow the skills we need in our high demand sector. These changes include introducing greater flexibility over when standalone English and maths qualifications are required for apprentices; from 11 February 2025, apprentices aged 19 years or older are no longer required to hold level 2 English and maths qualifications to complete their apprenticeship. This will allow many thousands more apprentices to complete their apprenticeships and enter employment, supporting vital sectors such as early years to meet skills and workforce demands. It will also open opportunity for many more potential apprentices currently excluded from apprenticeships due to not already holding English and maths qualifications.

Early Years Stronger Practice Hubs Extended Until March 2026

The Early Years Stronger Practice Hubs programme has been extended until March 2026. This means Hubs will continue to provide funded support and advice to improve quality in early years settings, by sharing evidence-informed practice through their local networks.
