

We will use the information provided by you to support and protect vulnerable adults involved with our service. The basis under which the Council uses personal data for this purpose is that this is necessary for the performance of a task carried out in the public interest by the Council or in the exercise of official authority vested in the Council.

We may use your information in producing a case study. This would only be after receiving your consent via the separate Community Together Service Case Study Consent form.

The information provided by you includes the following special categories of personal data:

- Race or ethnic origin
- Religious or philosophical beliefs
- Medical data
- Criminal Records
- Sexual orientation and gender identification

Information in these categories is used by the Council on the basis that such use is necessary for reasons of substantial public interest, and in accordance with the provisions of the Data Protection Act 2018. Information in these categories is used by the Council for statutory purposes under the Care Act 2014, Mental Capacity Act 2005 and The Mental Health Act 2017. When this information is only needed for monitoring the service, it will be anonymised.

You are not obliged, either by statute or by contract, to provide the information that is requested here.

The information that you have provided will be kept for 6 years.

The new data protection law known as the General Data Protection Regulation provides for the following rights as prescribed by the legislation:

- A right to request a copy of your information
- A right to request rectification of inaccurate personal data
- A right to request erasure of your data known as ‘the right to be forgotten’
- A right to in certain circumstances to request restriction of processing
- A right in certain circumstances to request portability of your data to another provider
- A right to object to processing of data in certain circumstances
- A right regarding automated decision making including profiling
