Childcare Expansion Funding – Final Round

If you want to apply for capital funding to support the creation of new early years entitlements places for children aged 3 and under in identified priority wards, or capital and revenue funding to support the expansion or creation of wraparound places, before and after school, for primary school aged children, the final deadline for applications is **23rd of January 2026**. PVI Funded Providers – Early Years Census – Deadline 30th January 2026

The Early Years Census is a data collection that collects provider and pupil data, and from January 2026 will take place each academic term (in January, May and October).

Letter from the Secretary of State for Education, Bridget Phillipson

The Secretary of State for Education, is addressing all educational settings with this message about [New training to help every child and young person thrive](#)

The message shares that:

- For school staff there will be a flexible training programme that will include a focus on developing adaptive teaching strategies, evidence-informed interventions for supporting a range of needs and working effectively with communities and parents.
- For early years practitioners, a new national CPD programme will provide free, accessible training focused on inclusive practice, child development and practical strategies for supporting children with SEND.

Safeguarding Updates

Government Consultation: Establishing a National Child Protection Authority

The government is consulting on plans to create a national Child Protection Authority (CPA) to strengthen safeguards against child abuse. More information [can be found here](#). The CPA would provide expert leadership to improve consistency and collaboration across the child protection system. The consultation closes on **5 March 2026**. Guidance Coming on Screen Time for Under-Fives

Research from the *Children of the 2020s* study ([COT20s – home learning environment and screen time at age 2: research brief](#)) shows that two-year-olds with the highest screen use (around 5 hours a day) speak significantly fewer words than those with the lowest use (around 44 minutes).

With 98% of toddlers using screens daily, the government will publish practical, non-judgemental advice this April to help families balance screen time with activities that support early learning, such as talking, playing, and reading together. Information will be shared as it becomes available.

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
